

Tom Power is the award-winning host of *Q* on CBC Radio One, where his warm, curious interview style has earned international recognition. He is a three-time Gold Medal winner for Best Interview at the New York Festivals — one of the highest honours in global broadcasting — for conversations with Michael J. Fox, Bono, and Mick Jagger. He has also hosted major Canadian-exclusive interviews with artists including Adele, Dua Lipa, and Shakira.

Since Tom took the helm in 2016, his hosting has helped make Q one of CBC's most successful modern programs — not only the country's most listened-to arts show on radio, but also a major digital force. His interviews have built a huge and loyal following on YouTube, TikTok, and Instagram, bringing new and younger audiences into Canadian cultural conversation while sustaining the show's strong national radio listenership.

A proud Newfoundlander from St. John's, Tom became the youngest national host in CBC history at 21 with the folk show *Deep Roots*. He later hosted *Radio 2 Morning* and anchored the national television series *What're You At?* during the pandemic, connecting Canadians through culture at a moment of profound isolation.

Tom is a founding member of The Dardanelles — a band central to the revival of traditional Newfoundland music — and is a regular player in Toronto's Irish and Newfoundland session scene. He also hosts *Toy Heart*, a podcast featuring intimate conversations with icons of bluegrass.

Most recently, Tom contributed an essay to the national #1 bestselling anthology *Elbows Up!*, alongside Margaret Atwood, Omar El Akkad, and Peter Mansbridge.
